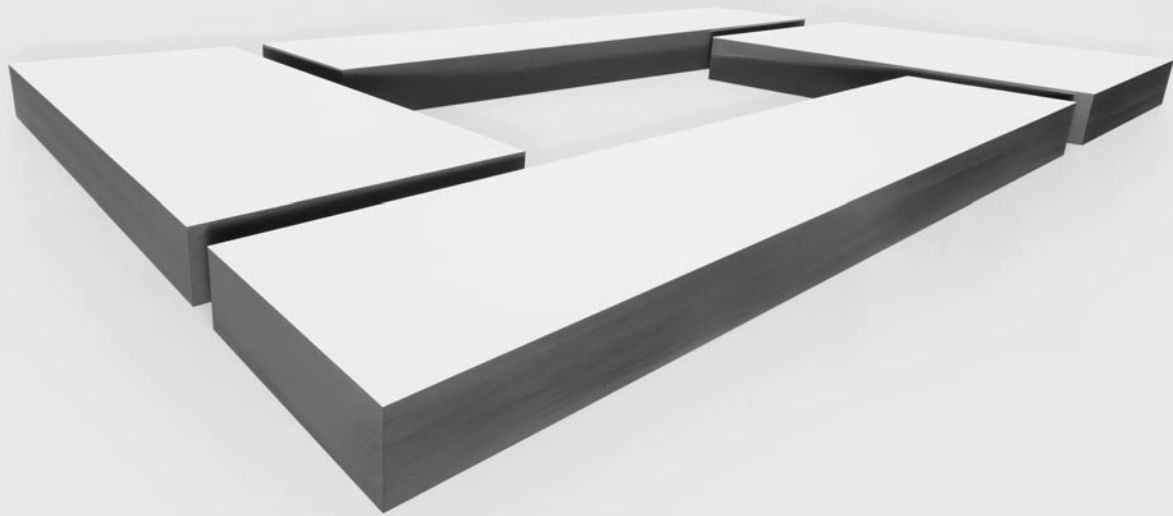

Dokumentationszentrum Oberer Kuhberg

From 1933 to 1935 Fort Oberer Kuhberg was the location of an early National Socialist concentration camp for the state of Württemberg. In addition to our permanent and special exhibition “Am I still allowed to say ...”, visitors can take guided tours of the prisoners’ accommodation and the rooms of the former concentration camp administration.

The colourful works of the artist couples Moll and Purrmann are presented under the title **"Mixed Double"**. The progressive artists were co-founders of the Académie Matisse in Paris and brought Henri Matisse's concept of art, which propagated pure colour surfaces and bright contrasts, to Germany. The exhibition traces the similarities but also explores the four artists' individual approaches to modernism.

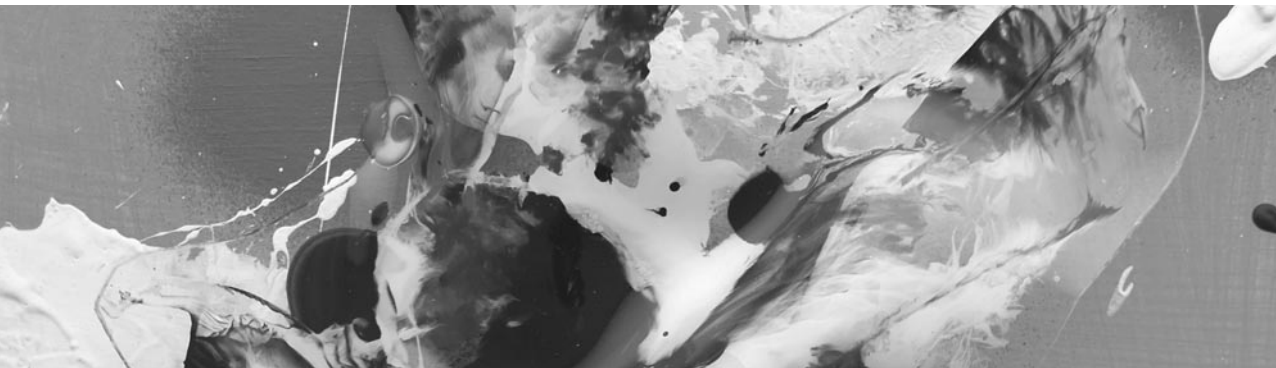

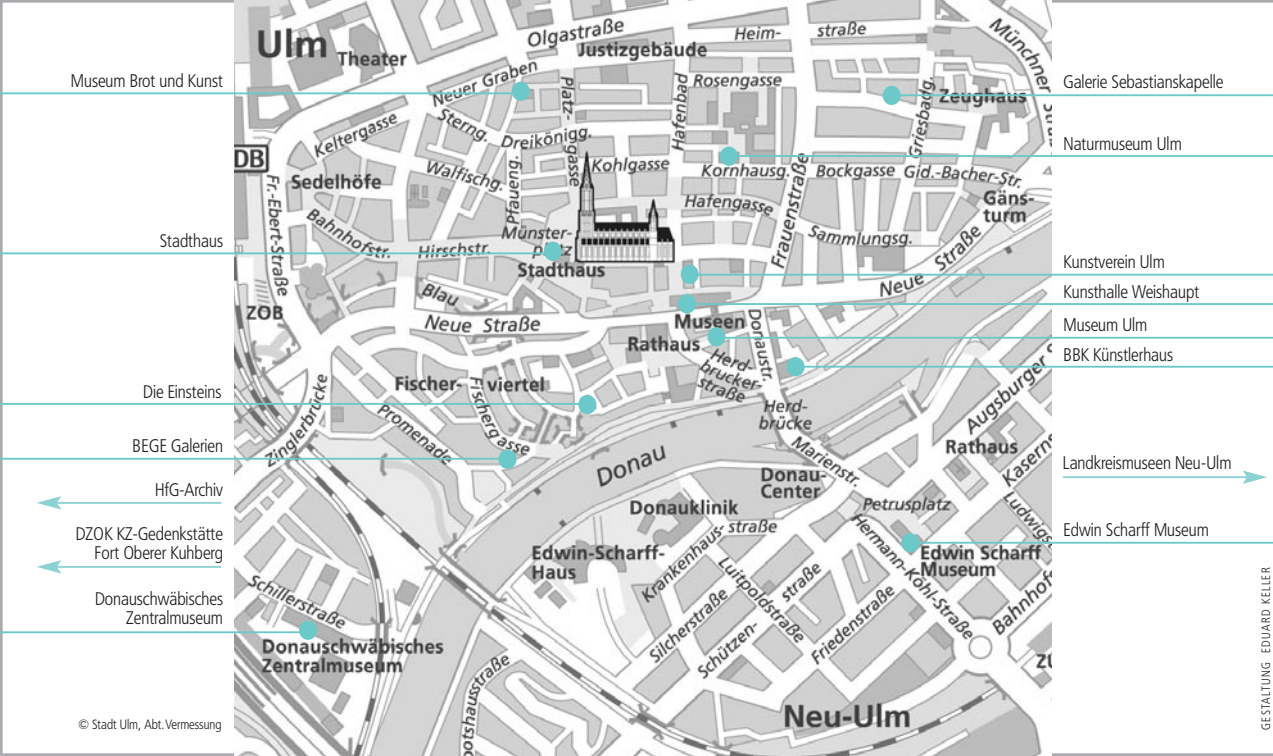
